And of course thanks to our members who made it a very enjoyable luncheon.

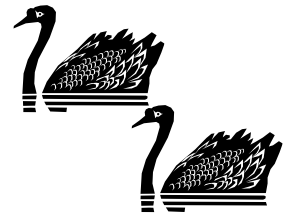

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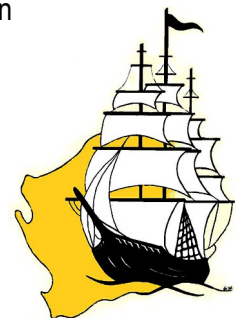

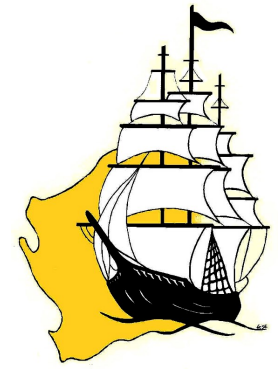

THE STORY OF JOSEPH DICKS

When Bryan Dicks applied for his Certificate for Joseph Dicks in September 2017 we did not know much at all about the Dicks family. On our 'First Families' database we had ship unknown, but the Bicentennial Dictionaries said he was listed in a petition in 1832 - he was assigned land at Fremantle (lot 532) but lost it due to non payment in 1841. Our records showed that he gave notice to depart the colony in 1835 and this notice appeared in the Perth Gazette and Western Australian Journal on Saturday 17 January 1835.

When Bryan put in his application he sent me a package of papers which I have now found and the mystery of Joseph Dicks has come to light.

Joseph William Dicks was born 9th January 1809 in Wiltshire, England. He left England on the 27th December 1829 arriving in Capetown, South Africa on the 30th March 1830. He then departed from Capetown on the vessel 'Medina' on 12th May 1830 and arrived in the Swan River Colony on the 6th July 1830. He was not recorded on the passenger list but may have been a servant of the Munday brothers according to a diary entry by a John Thomas Pocock.

Joseph was not too impressed with the new Colony of Swan River and decided to return to England to visit his mother via South Africa.

He departed on the ship 'Dart' on the 6th February 1835 travelling via Mauritius and arrived in Capetown, South Africa in March 1835. But when he arrived in Capetown there was a letter waiting for him to tell him that his mother had died. So he decided to remain in Capetown, South Africa.

Joseph met up and married Jane Loxton in St. John's Church, Wynberg on 5th December 1836. Jane was born 1st August in Pilton, Somersetshire, England and she had emigrated with her parents to South Africa. By the time of her marriage the Loxton's were a well known Capetown family. Joseph and Jane Dicks lived in Capetown for 10 years before they decided to explore new pastures.

The family left Capetown on 28th August 1846 on the ship 'Flora' and arrived in Durban, Natal, South Africa on 14th September 1846. Jane's brother Henry went with them.

Natal was then a new province of South Africa, without towns or roads and with a small native population. There was a small European population and the country was abounding with wild animals including elephants. They first lived 'near the park' in Durban and then in Pietermaritzburg. Then they moved to the Vanderplank's farm near Otto's and to the little Bushmans River near Doornkop. But then had to move again due to trouble with the Zulus. On their return to the property they found all their crops destroyed and the roof of their house pulled off by monkeys.

They then moved to Maritzburg they spent four years on 'Mill Park' farm (now Adamhurst) near Howick. Joseph Dicks and a George Holgate were the sole residents of Howick and considered to be the founders of the town.

In 1860 Prince Alfred, the second son of Queen Victoria visited the town and it believed that Joseph and his wife Jane entertained the royal.

Joseph is believed to have brought blue gum and wattle seeds from Western Australia and Howick was soon known for its tall Australian gum trees. He also imported plants and shrubs from England and had a beautiful English country garden in the Government Gardens in Natal.

Joseph was very keen on botany and it is believed he brought the first gum seeds to South Africa.

Joseph died at the home of his son at Greendale in Howick, Natal on 18th July 1883 and his death certificate describes him as a farmer.

Jane Dicks died 9th November 1897 and is buried next to Joseph at St.Lukes, Howick, Natal, South Africa. The family were originally Church of England but converted to Methodism which they followed for the rest of their lives.

Bryan Dicks (great grandson of Joseph Dicks) with his son and daughter returned to Western Australia fairly recently and are living in the northern suburbs and are proud holders of a Certificate of Descendancy. Welcome back Dicks family!



The Ship 'Medina'

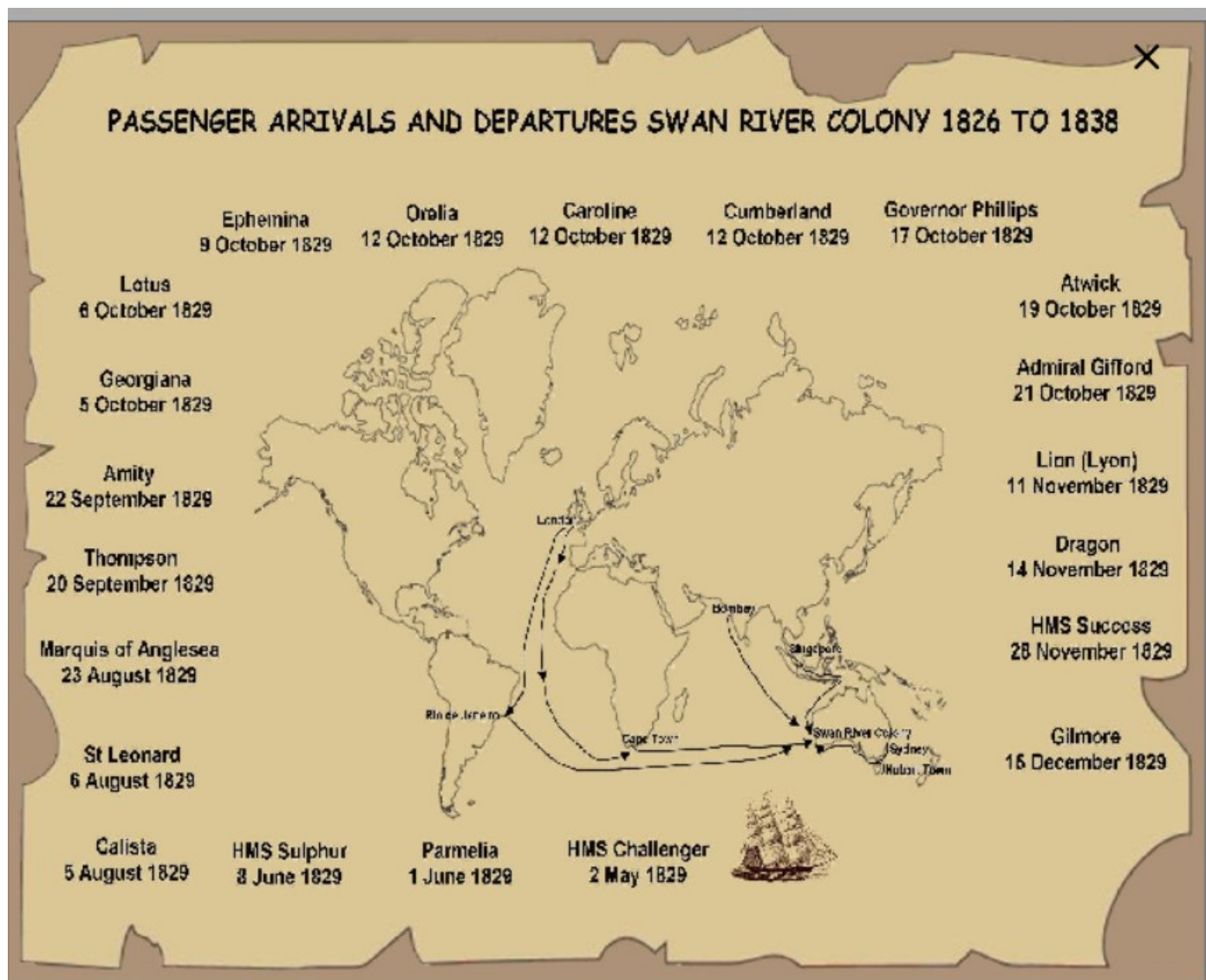
The *Medina*, of 467 tons, arrived 6 July 1830, with (51 or) 52 passengers including John Bateman, Alfred Waylen, Dr G.S.F. Cowcher, and Anthony Curtis. The ship's name is thought to come from that of a river on the Isle of Wight. A suburb in southern Perth is in turn named after the ship.

The *Medina* was apparently Captain Pace's ship. Captain Pace's wife kept an inn at first called Mrs Pace's and then the Crown & Thistle, etc., on the site of the present-day P&O Hotel - now part of Notre Dame University.

Bateman, Waylen and Curtis all went into the hotel business, while Dr Cowcher attempted to do so, but failed.

Calista, Orelia, Medina, Parmelia, and Leda are southern suburbs of Perth named after early ships.

Note: Joseph Dicks did not appear on the shipping list but believed to be a servant of the Munday's.

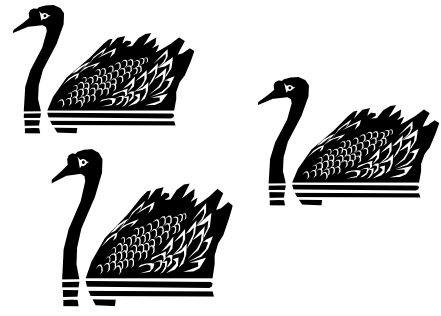
