#### IN HONOUR OF OUR ANZACS THE 10TH LIGHT HORSE REGIMENT – WESTERN AUSTRALIA

#### The Adventure

When our families left their homes and sailed away to start new lives in Western Australia, to build a new and prosperous colony, many were escaping towns of squalor, poverty, illness and death. The promise of freedom from these things would have been difficult to resist! Like yearning for a Messiah to rescue them from a weary, repressed existence, our families were yearning for a ship to carry them towards a better existence where they and their children could thrive for generations to come. Little did they know the harsh realities that faced them at their destination.

In the early 1900's (not even a hundred years after the arrival of our families, carried by those saviour ships to our shores) there was excitement among their descendants with the call to war. World War I was declared and the new West Australians were needed to help win the battles. For young boys who had never known life outside the colony, the opportunity to travel was exciting! Along with this, the lure of patriotic duty and a new job away from the arduous and failed work of farming, was what drew two young men to eagerly sign up - this might be a task they could actually win! This story focuses on these two boys and their journey with the legendary Western Australian 10th Light Horse Regiment.

Frank Eric (Ric) Throssell, 33 and Hugo Vivian Hope (Jim) Throssell, 30, joined the Light Horse, along with so many other brave and excited young men, and enthusiastically set off with their noble steeds to fight the battles in order to keep and secure our fortunate, new Australian way of life. Just like their ancestors, little did they know the harsh realities that faced them at their destination - and little did they know they would be living in squalor, poverty, illness and death.

Eric and Hugo were not just brothers, they were best friends. Both were born in Northam, a town where their great grandfather, John Morrell turned the first soil (along with William and Peter Chidlow) and their father, our 2nd State Premier, George Throssell developed an economic empire. Eric and Hugo enjoyed an affluent life along with their hard-working, churchgoing parents and 10 siblings. They were a respected, upper-class family (due to George Throssell's influence in almost every aspect of business and charity within the Town and then the State). Hugo was the youngest and the epitome of the "Aussie Larrikin". A strong athlete, he




was educated at Prince Alfred College in Adelaide where he was captain of the football team and a champion boxer. He later spent time working as a jackaroo on cattle stations in the north of the state. Eric was the more reserved of the two and perhaps, being the older one, balanced Hugo's impulsiveness with his own sensibility.



After their mother died in 1906 and their father in 1910 and their siblings had married and moved on (most in Northam, Perth and Mount Lawley), Eric and Hugo tried their hand at farming in Cowcowing. They were both determined but time spent during a drought in the Wheatbelt proved they were not great farmers, nor did they really aspire to be. So, in December 1914, the brothers decided to try a new vocation. They mounted their horses with their belongings and set off to join "The Tenth" - the only AIF Light Horse Unit raised in Western Australia.

The boys trained at Blackboy Hill, Stirling Square Guildford and the Guildford Remount Depot then Rockingham and Claremont before embarking from Fremantle towards their grandest of adventures. On board with their horses and new mates, they vowed to fight, and win, for a homeland that Eric would never return to.

#### The 10th Light Horse Regiment – a very brief summary

"There never has been a closer bond between man and animal than that which exists between the veteran Light horseman and his Waler. After the front line, his horse is his first anxiety. He stands between rations and the man's own health." *The Herald (Melbourne)* Walers at War. 28/11/1918 p12.



The British Government declared war with Germany on 5<sup>th</sup> August 1914 and the Australian Federal Government was quick to offer 20,000 Australian troops. Two months later, the Governor General announced the formation of the 3rd Australian Light Horse Brigade, of which the 10th Light Horse Regiment was the Western Australian contribution. The mounted corps included field ambulance, machine gunners, signallers and men who were later transferred into the Camel Corps.

Many were selected into the Regiment who had their own horses, such as Eric and Hugo Throssell. Many of the boys' new mates within the Regiment were also from pioneering families, like Wilfred and Gresley Harper (sons



of Charles and Fanny Harper) from Guildford Grammar School who resided at Woodbridge House on the banks of the upper Swan River (land originally owned by Governor James Stirling).

Before leaving, it was decided that all 3rd Brigade Light Horsemen from Victoria, South Australia and Western Australia would wear emu feathers in their hats, to help establish an "spirit de corp". *The Leader, (Melbourne)* 12/12/1914. P42

The men cared for their horses on board and bonded closely with them. They were mounted infantry but fought on foot, riding into battle in sections of four with one trooper nominated as "horse holder" while the other three confronted the enemy. Dundas B. *Dedication of Guildford's 10<sup>th</sup> Light Horse Statue* 2023.

The 10th LH Regiment left their horses and fought as infantry at Gallipoli where they experienced an appalling loss of life and casualties at the Nek on 7 August and Hill 60 on 29-30 August 1915.

Hugo was in charge of his troop at the Nek. Eric was injured but survived. The Harper brothers didn't make more than 20 metres before dying instantly. Nine officers and 73 of Hugo's unit were killed within minutes of "That Fool Charge", as Hugo called it.

Later, at Hill 60, battle had been raging for a week with heavy losses. On 29<sup>th</sup> August (the day of Hugo and Eric's great niece's - my grandmother's - first birthday) the 10th Light Horse was again brought into action. Hugo was a guard and killed five Turks while his men constructed a barricade across their part of the trench. There was a fierce bomb fight that lasted all night between the enemy trenches. Imagine someone lobbing tennis balls over a fence into your yard then you lobbing them back, all night, for hours without a break, but the tennis balls are made of cast iron, weigh up to 3kg each, and will explode if you don't throw them back quick enough. This is what happened throughout that night at Hill 60.

Hugo and his mates held their fused bombs until the last possible moment before hurling them at the enemy on the other side. They also hurled back those which landed on their side. Both sides threw between 3000 and 4000 bombs. Hugo, with blood on his face, splinters in his forehead, wounded in his neck and his shoulder badge with the word, 'Australia' embedded into his arm, repeatedly yelled encouragement to the men who were left. He refused to leave when given the order (twice) to do so.

Some sealed their fate by not letting go of a bomb in time, such as Sid Ferrier who lost his arm in the trenches, later developed tetanus from infection and died on the hospital ship before making it out.


Hugo was so affected by Sid's death, watching his body be placed on a stretcher and covered with a Union Jack before being tilted over the stern of the *Devanha* and slid into the waters of the Atlantic. After evacuation to England, Hugo wrote to Sid's mother telling her of Sid's bravery.

"...I cannot tell you how I feel about it, dear Mrs Ferrier. I have seen many brave men the last few months, and although there may be plenty of men just as brave, there never lived a **braver** man than your son. This is a wonderful war, and though your son has not been awarded so far, any honour, it will be comforting to you to know that in the eyes of his comrades he earned the Victoria Cross dozens of times over."

For his service at Hill 60, Hugo later received that highest award for valour from HM King George V at Buckingham Palace. It was the first Victoria Cross medal to be awarded to a West Australian in the Great War and the only to be awarded to a Light Horseman. However, Hugo never considered himself any more worthy than any of his mates who he fought with. To be hailed a hero never sat well with him.



Promoted to Captain, Hugo re-joined his regiment, and his brother, in Egypt. In April 1917 he was wounded at the second battle of Gaza and was crawling across the



battlefield under enemy fire at night, searching among the dead and dying for Eric who had disappeared. He whistled for him, as they used to back home. Eric had been killed in action. His body was later retrieved and buried at the Gaza War Cemetery.

The Tenth disbanded after the conclusion of the War. Surviving, unfit for service horses, had to be destroyed, many being shot by their riders. The men who were left from The Tenth came home to the land they had fought for and were met by pageantry and cheers, although the excitement and enthusiasm the soldiers had felt back in 1914 was replaced by four years of pain, both physical and psychological. The people of Northam were left dumfounded by their hero's speech as Hugo claimed himself to be made a socialist by the War. Hugo never recovered from his injuries, illnesses, shellshock or his grief over losing his brother. With failing eyesight, he was refused any government medical assistance. He tried new business ventures to keep his family afloat, including a Rodeo on his Greenmount property, but fell deeper into debt. In 1933, the past 15 years culminated in a single

gunshot to the head (the same as had killed his brother Eric). Found by his brother-in-law on the veranda of his home in Greenmount, Hugo had ended his own life.

Hugo left his wife (author and communist Katharine Susannah Prichard) and his young son, Richard ("Ric", after Hugo's brother) to bear the scars.

"I can't sleep. I feel my old war head. It's going phut, and that's no good for anyone concerned." Hugo Throssell.

*"He died for his country just as surely as if he had perished in the trenches." Chaplain Collick.*

The Town of Guildford, home of the paddocks where the 10th Light Horse Regiment was raised, once alive with the sound of loud military commands and neighing of horses at 6am gun fire are now silent of those memories. It is now a place for peace, worship, play and contemplation. In June 2017, the community's desire to recognise the Regiment resulted in the formation of the Guildford Light Horse Statue Committee, which led to an unveiling in 2023 of a statue of a soldier and his horse to commemorate the service given by the 10th Light Horse Regiment in World War 1 (sculpted by Mr Charles Robb, Artist and Senior Lecturer in Visual Art at QUT, Meanjin/Brisbane).

Hugo paid tribute to the Australian horses that carried him and his men through the dry and barren landscape:

"Their powers of endurance were remarkable. Water supply proved the greatest problem in the desert, the Turks destroying the wells as they retreated.

During one period of 10 weeks during which the heat was well nigh unbearable, the animals did not average one drink per day. Frequently they ran into a second or third day without a drink sometimes being without water for 50 hours. No horse carried less than 20 stone with rider and equipment, and sometimes there would be no opportunity of removing their burdens for days.

Sometimes the animals were in such poor condition they would chew the harness upon them and it was not an uncommon sight to see them chew on another's manes and tails.

They were simply wonderful the way they stood up to it on their rations." Hamilton, J. The Price of Valour, 2012.


# Swan River Pioneers - Name Badges






## Coming Events 2023
