In June 1829, a group of people arrived on the west coast of Australia whose original lands were 15,000 kilometres away. They were the British. They brought with them a culture that was European, but unique when compared to others in Europe.

Dr Burke would like to share insights about how these people adapted to the distinctive physical environment of Western Australia, and how they – and others – formed a new cultural group.

Morning tea will be served at the conclusion of this event.
